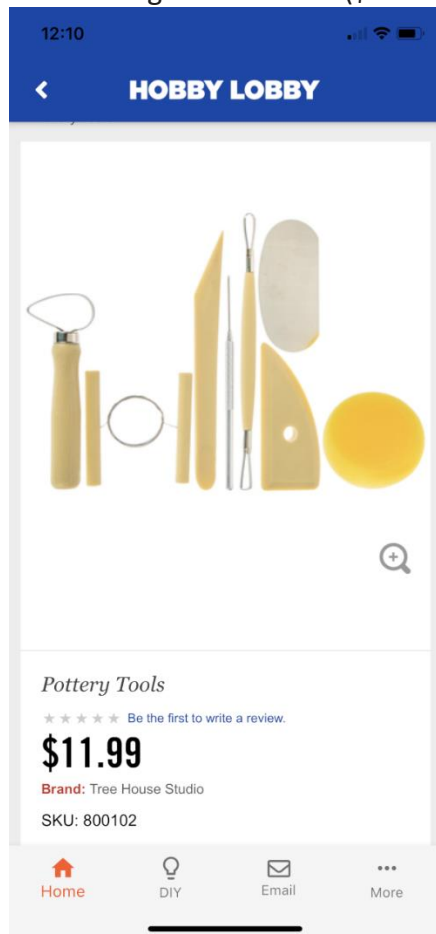

- scientific calculator Having a calculator can greatly help with homework and test prep. I recommend the TI-30X IIS (under \$10 many places) or a graphing calculator. We will be using the TI-Nspire CX in class, but it is a bit pricier so another good option is TI-84 Plus CE Silver Edition (or any TI-84). If you cannot get a graphing calculator, it is very understandable and will not hinder the learning process. I would recommend at least trying to get the TI-30X IIS scientific calculator if at all possible.

*Please understand that if students demonstrate a lack of ability to perform math operations by hand they may not be permitted to use a calculator until they get help from me with the basics.
